Children in Need 2018:


We had a fantastic whole

What's On: Extra Curricular Events

A Year of Prayer: On Tuesday 27 November, Bishop Declan launched the Year of Prayer at Clifton Cathedral. In a celebration of evening prayer he presented to each parish, community and school in the diocese the resources for the Year of Prayer starting this Sunday, the First Sunday of Advent. In his message, Bishop Declan said that although we focus our attention upon prayer, mission is not finished, but we continue to reflect upon mission with a spirit of prayer. He continued to say that prayer is a conversation with God and is a conversation with others. It is not a one-way conversation but that the conversation we have in prayer is one both of speaking but above all of listening.

The chaplaincy team and staff will be reflecting on how we can enrich still further the current prayer life at St Dominic's which was judged as Outstanding in our Section 48 inspection in June. We will aim to continue to build meaningful links with our parish community and help to develop children's understanding of prayer.

The chaplaincy team will be commissioned in Clifton Cathedral today (Friday 30th November) with Primary School children from across the diocese in a special service. Mrs Sollars and Miss Fletcher will be accompanying them.

Rugby Tournament: Next week , on **Wednesday 5th December**, children in KS2 will take part in an inter-school Rugby tournament to represent our school. I am sure that they will have a great time and we wish them luck. Miss Mansell, is organizing this event and more information will be coming out to the parents of children who will be taking part.

<u>Trip to the Pantomime - Friday 14th December:</u> We are all very much looking forward to going to the Bristol Hippodrome to see Cinderella. Please remember to send your child into school with a packed lunch and they will be required to wear school uniform for this event.
