The Curriculum:

This week in the curriculum we have had lots of active learning opportunities. The week began with our whole school trip, spread over two days to the Nympsfield glider airfield where the children had a lovely time exploring the planes and learning more about flight. I would like to say a big thank you to Mrs McLaughlin and the people at Nympsfield for organising this for us; the children loved it and it was great way to learn about aspects of their locality.

There has been a real buzz in learning over the last term across the school.

Children have been carrying lots of science experiments in all classes and using their mathematical and writing skills to





complete practical tasks. Mr Peter Lead visited school and all classes were engaged in the extraction of the honey and Class 4 have had their forest school day at Copsegrove Farm focused on team building skills.



In addition this week we have had a multi-cultural focus week, where the children have been exploring other faiths by learning about the Hindu festival of Diwali. Today, I would like to say Kon'nichiwa, irasshai (Hello, welcome) to the Japanese students who are visiting us. We are very much looking forward to their visit and hope they enjoy their time at our school. This is a great fantastic opportunity for the children to explore similarities and differences between our two cultures. I am sure the children in KS2 will also love developing their origami skills through the activities that they will be sharing. I would especially like to thank our school governor Mrs Thurbon for organising the morning for us and for assisting on the day. Over half term the teachers will be putting together more pictures and information for their class pages on our website to show case some of this term's learning.
