
We marked the start of Lent and the beginning of the new term with a whole school Mass today and I hope that you were able to join us. Next week, the children will be planning some fund raising activities in their house teams for CAFOD and other Charities that they decide to support.

One Night at the Museum: We currently organising our trip to the museums in Oxford to support the children's learning in our current topic. We aim to have the information out to you as soon as possible. Class 1 and Class 2 are planning to go to the Natural History Museum in Oxford and Class 3 and Class 4 will go the Ashmolean Museum.

We hope to provide tea and coffee in the hall and all children's books will be placed there for you to view before your appointment. Please go to your child's classroom at your allotted time and knock on the door to let the teacher know you are waiting.



World Book Day – Let's share a book! This takes place on **Thursday 1st March**, We will be giving £1 book vouchers to every child and will use the day to celebrate reading. We will do this by enabling the older children to share stories with younger children in class and we will also launch our very own St Dominic's Reading Challenge! The PTA have organised a second hand book sale and we will be running a book fair for a week from 15th March which will be supervised for sales at the end of the day. Although we are happy for children to come dressed as their favourite story character on Thursday this is not compulsory – apologies for the short notice on this!

Instead they may like to wait until **Friday 2nd March** with the **Big Yellow Friday Dress up Day:** This day has been set aside, at the request of a parent, for us to raise money for children who have been affected by childhood liver disease. Children are being asked to dress in yellow for a small donation towards this worthy charity (Children's Liver Disease Foundation) who work with children and their parents who suffer the consequences of liver disease. We look forward to a very colourful week ahead!
